### Taskforce Objectives & Scope

- Develop a recommendation regarding the removal, relocation or repurposing of Vance monument
- Develop and implement and inclusive community engagement plan focusing on those harmed and/ or most negatively impacted by the Vance Monument
- Develop a list of African Americans to honor the local history of Asheville-Buncombe County

### Timeline & Milestones | Aug 20 – Nov 19, 2020

- August 20<sup>th</sup> | September 3<sup>rd</sup> | September 10<sup>th</sup> | Taskforce members undergo orientation, outline timeline, and develop a a needs-based strategy in order to complete the scope of work.
- September 17<sup>th</sup> | September 24<sup>th</sup> | October 1<sup>st</sup>| Taskforce members undergo a period of historical analysis and community education, hearing from community leaders, historians, and educators from the African-American community, and Eastern Band of Cherokee Indian community.

#### THECITYOF **VANCE MONUMENT TASKFORCE** COMMUNITY INPUT


The Vance Monument Task Force (VMTF) was created by joint resolution by the City of Asheville and Buncombe County. The VMTF is tasked with gathering citizen input, particularly from those most impacted by the monuments, and will make a recommendation to the governing bodies in November 2020 to remove or repurpose the Vance Monument within lead requirements.

## **Community Engagement**

The following quotes were notable from the October 22<sup>nd</sup> & 29<sup>th</sup> virtual town halls, and were selected as a small representation of the kind of input that was heard from various citizens.

"I am a senior at SILSA and the leader of Keeping it R.E.A.L. which is the first of its kind at Asheville High School and SILSA and I'm calling from West Asheville....my recommendation for the Vance Monument is for its removal, and that the money for its removal should come from grants and other financial resources rather than taxpayer-funded. This is wage to the monument being built by repressive forces and should be demolished without the need from taxes from the very people it is currently offending. Thank you for donating your time to this endeavor and removing an emblem of hate" – **Seth Bellamy** 

"As a direct descendant of Vance...removing the monument does not erase my family's legacy, but it does represent a small step toward repairing the harm my family legacy imposed upon this community, which I call home and I deeply love. On behalf of my family, I thank you for your work." – **Noel Nickle** 

"I would like to see the Vance Monument removed. I think that it is cultural appropriation at its finest...I don't see how you would repurpose what it was originally erected for just by placing a plaque upon it or a painting it some different colors. It's not going to change the nature of what it is and who it was erected for and what it [obelisk] is meant to do throughout the Egyptian belief system. I do not believe that it should be kept in the form of fashion that it is..." – **Robert Thomas** 

### Timeline & Milestones | Aug 20 – Nov 19, 2020

- November 5<sup>th</sup> | Taskforce members work in small groups to conduct due diligence.
- November 12<sup>th</sup> | November 19<sup>th</sup> | Taskforce members present total findings from small group work, historical analysis, public input and community engagement. Final recommendation voted.



### **Final Recommendation**

Taskforce members received over 700+ comments, conducted 2 virtual town halls, engaged with history over 4 key education sessions, and deliberated over a period of 12 weeks, including small group work and all contributing toward making a final recommendation.

Taskforce votes on a final recommendation to remove with a vote of 11-1 at the November 19<sup>th</sup> public meeting.

### **Final Recommendation**

- Prior to 2016 1800 monuments, plaques, and buildings to individuals and activities related to the Confederate States of America. Half of those were monuments
- ✓ 124 have been removed since 2016
- ✓ 59 removed since May 2020
- ✓ 19 of those in North Carolina

## **Recommended Next Step & Considerations**

- To complete a starter list of people and events from the African American community that could be included in the future of the square. The completed list can be expected by no later than Jan 26, 2021.
- To seek alternative funding sources that are directed to: Placemaking, Outdoor Art & Changing spaces once help by Confederate monuments.
- To pursue educational opportunities for the community on issues related to Confederate monuments such as the work of the Mellon Fund for Monuments
- To develop a vision of the square to be connected to other social enterprises in the community that return wealth creation in all communities.
